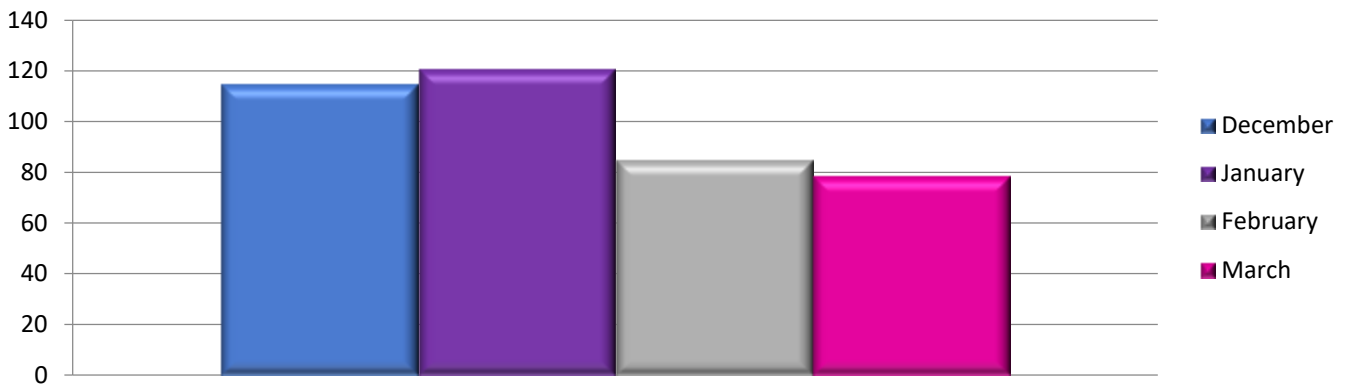

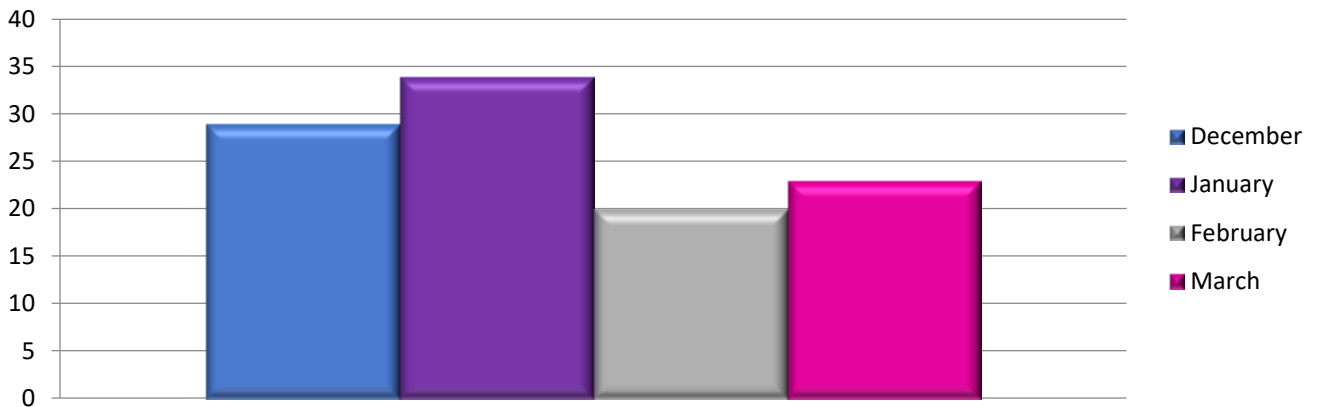

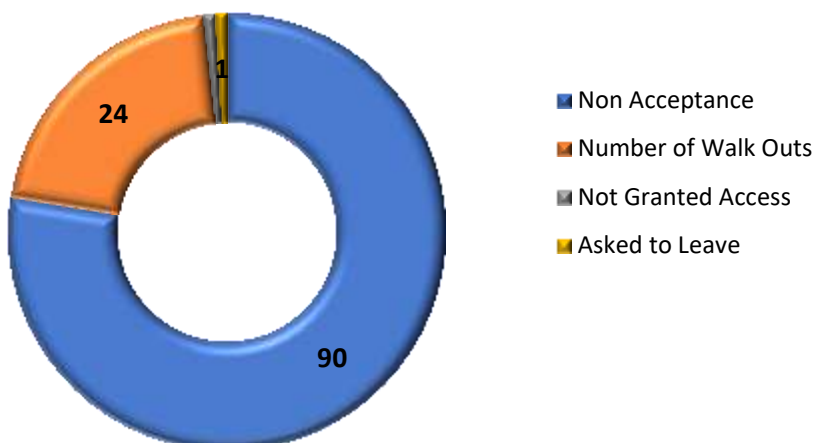
Number of Beds Used for the Project

Unsuccessful Stays during the Project

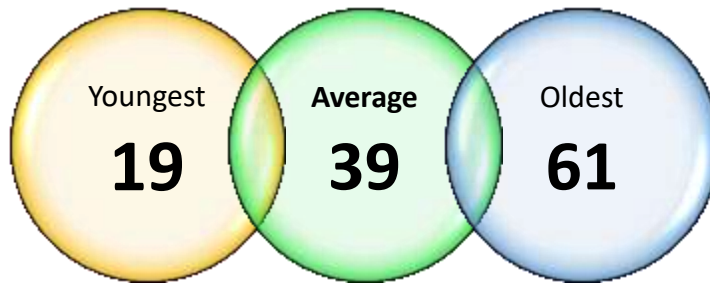


265 Showers were taken by guests

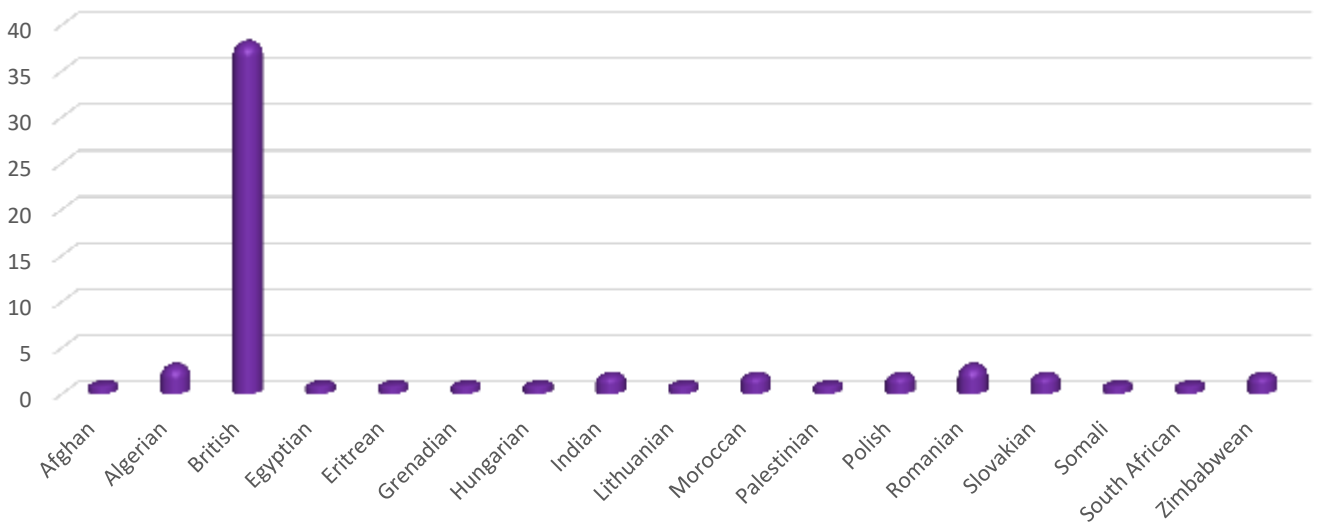

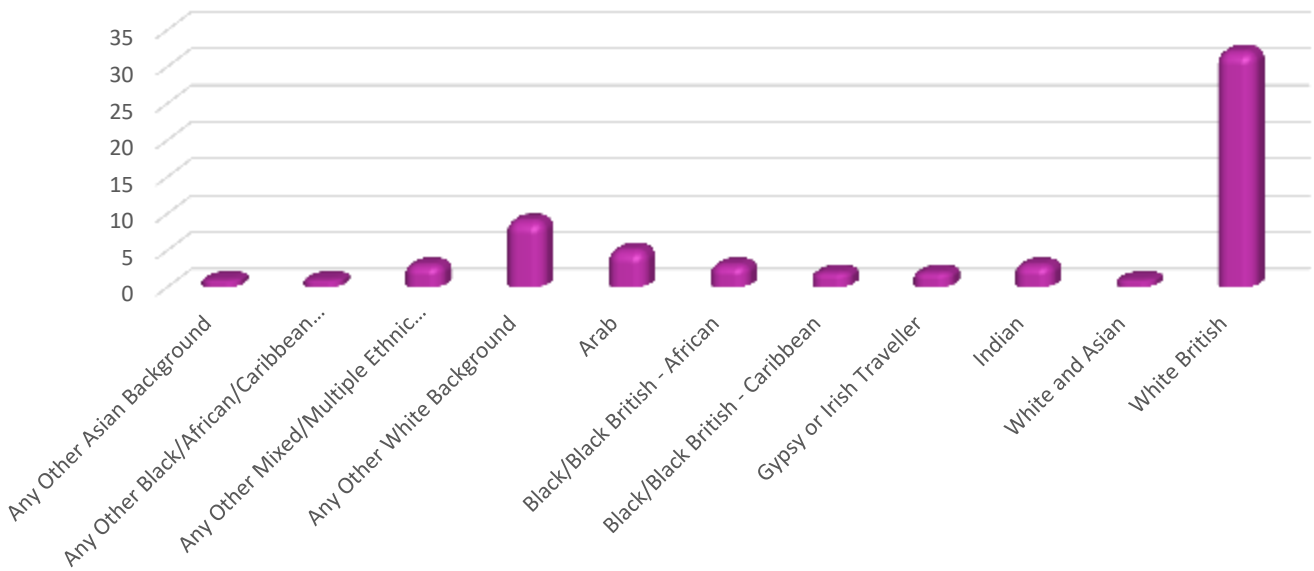

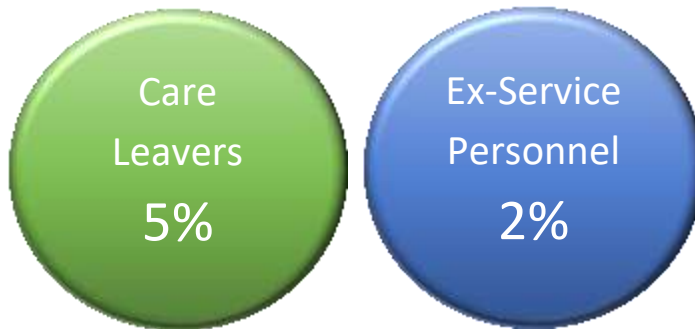
Non-British Nationals Accessing the Shelter



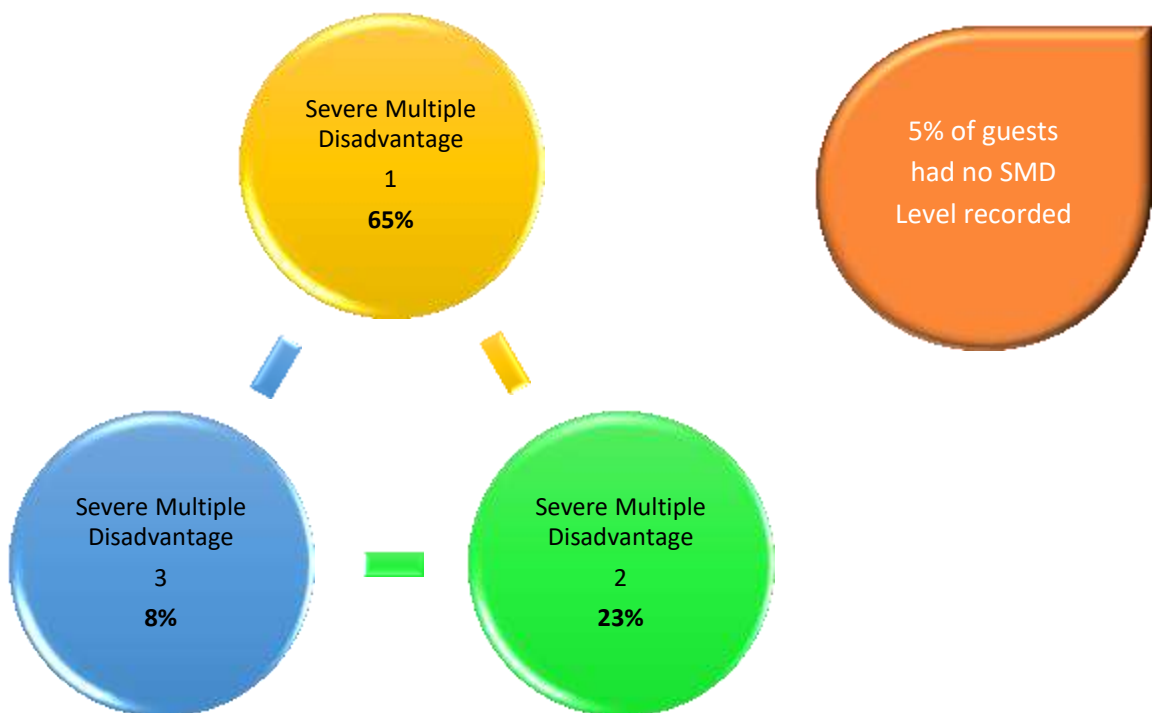

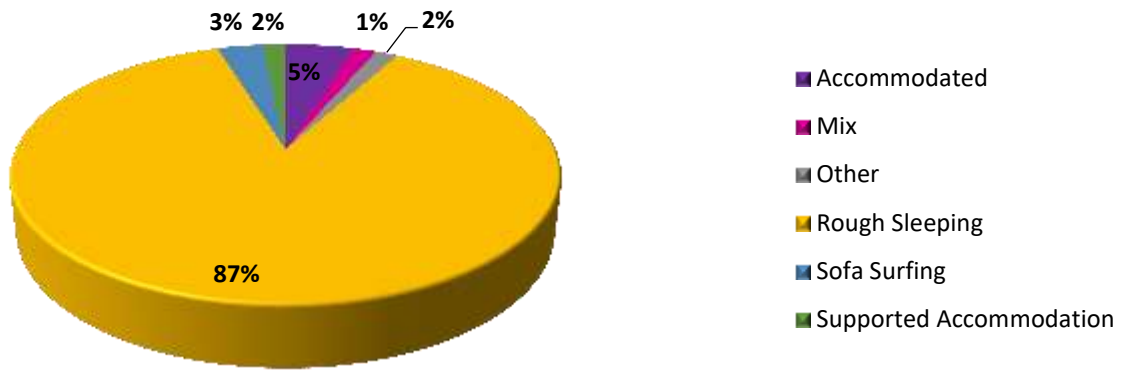


Severe and Multiple Disadvantage

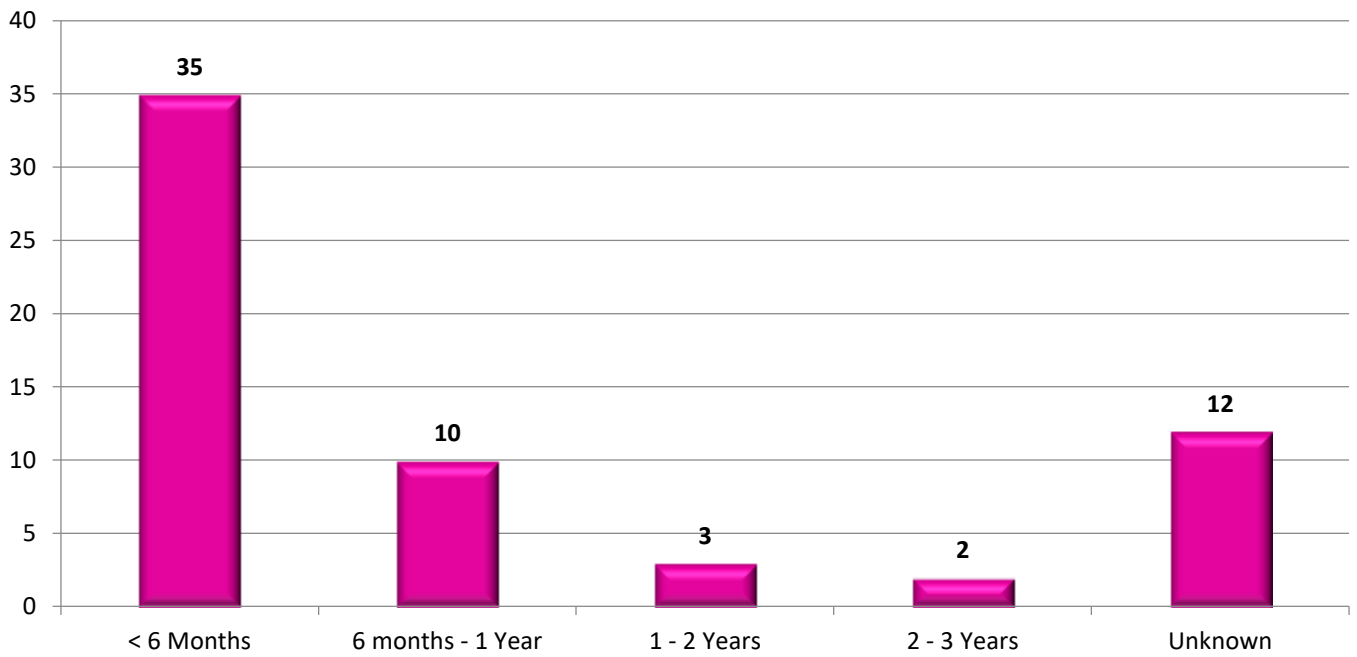

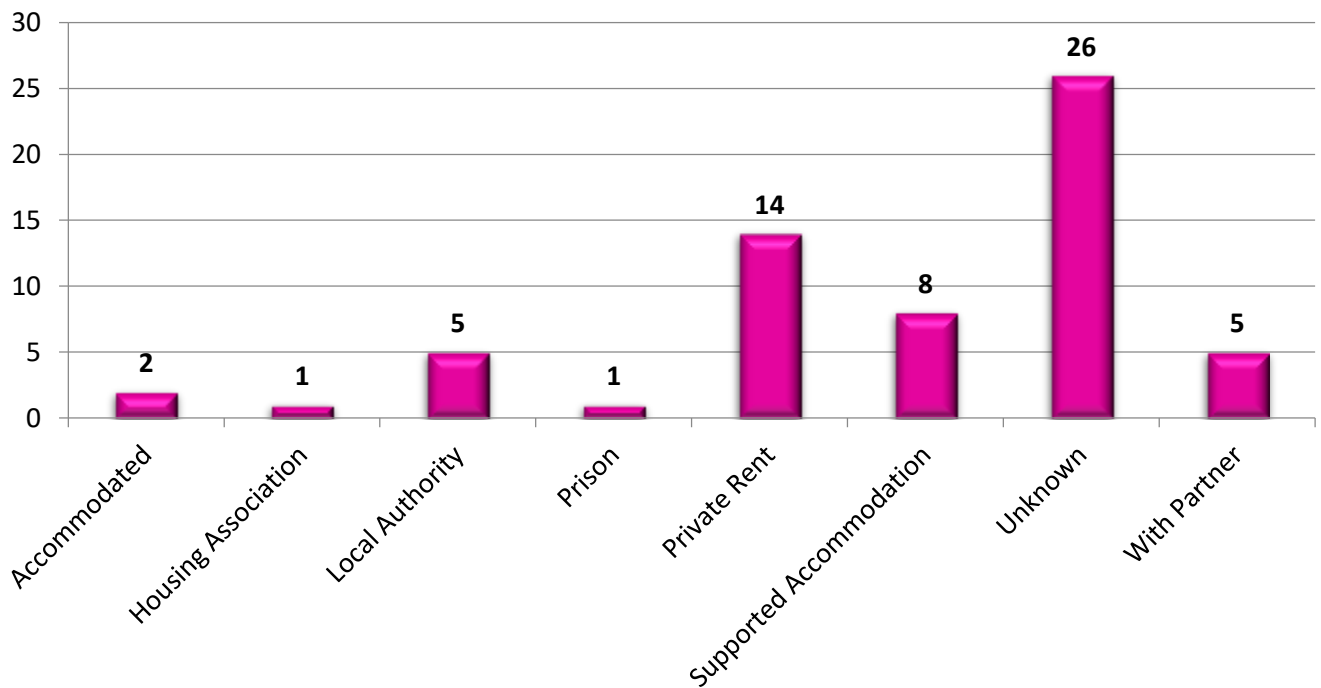
Current Situation

Last Known Tenancy Type



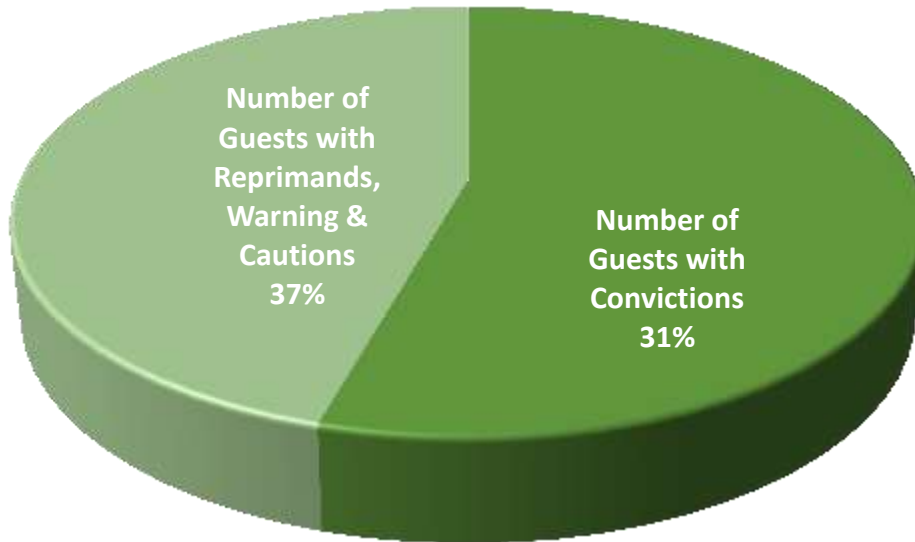
Offending

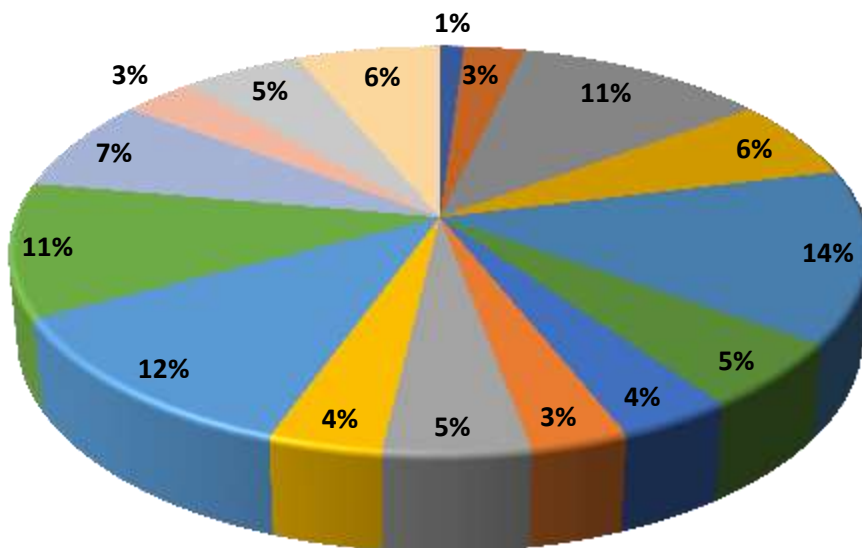

Substance/Alcohol Misuse

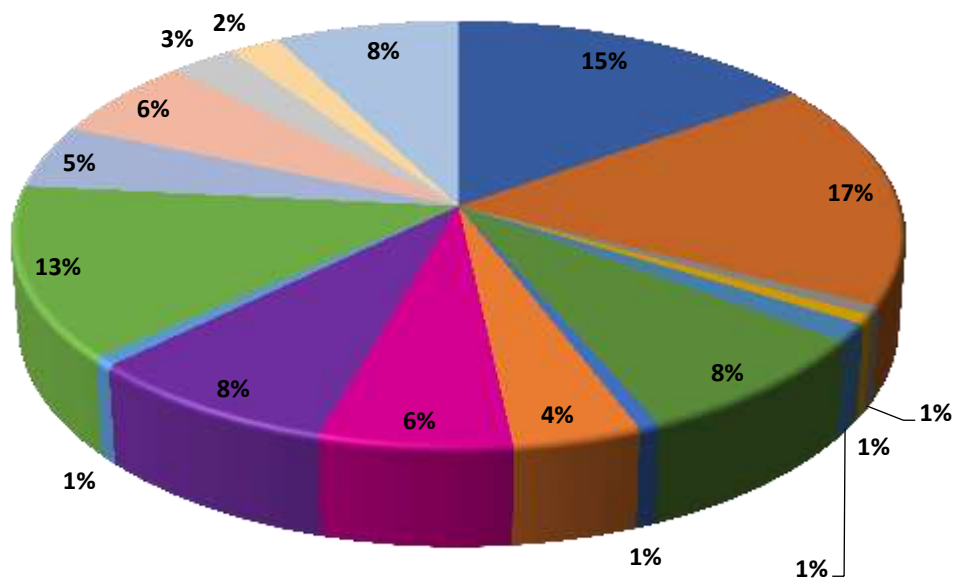


Drug usage of the 16%



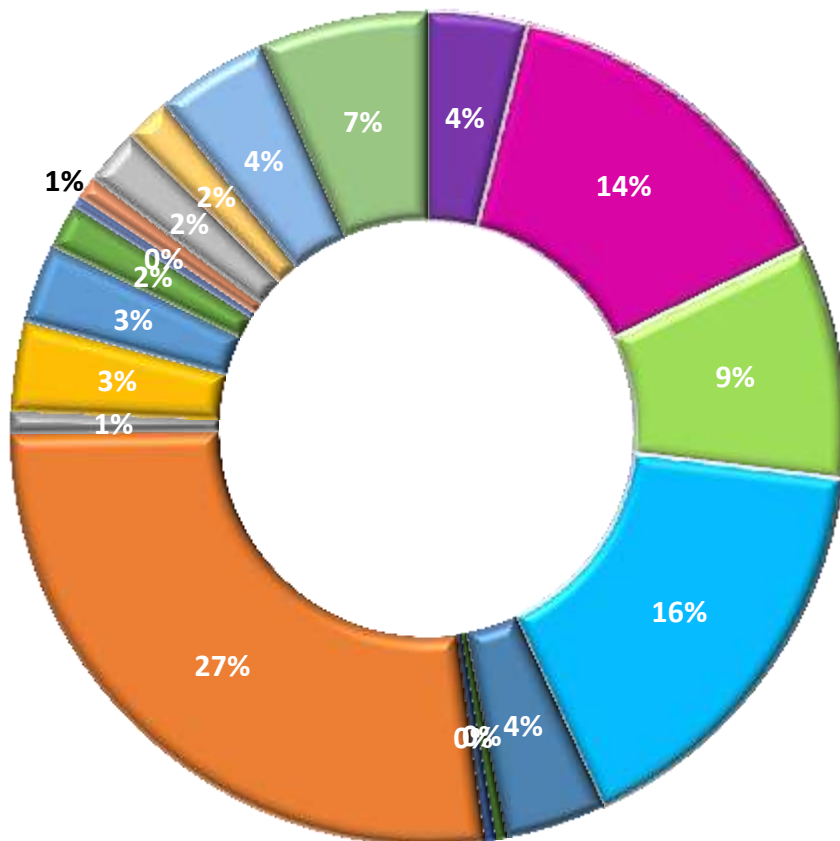
Reasons for Actual Homelessness

- Relatives/friends unable/unwilling to house
- Domestic violence
- LA possession action
- Housing association possession action
- Private Accomm Rent Arrears
- Delays in HB claims
- Anti-social behaviour
- Hospital Discharge to Street Homelessness
- Other
- Relationship breakdown (excluding divorce)
- Harassment/illegal eviction
- LA Rent Arrears
- Private landlord possession action
- Unable to afford rent in PR Accomm
- LA won't re-house permanently
- Prison Release to Street Homelessness
- Evicted from Supported Accommodation



Outcomes

- Client showed improved self worth/self esteem
- Client formed positive relationships
- Client received support, advice and advocacy
- Client supported emotionally, socially and psychologically
- Client showed increased self confidence
- Client engaged with recreational and community activities
- Client allocated a GP
- Client accessed Winter Night Shelter
- Client reconnected
- Client received temporary accommodation
- Client accommodated in private rent accommodation
- Client accommodated in supported accommodation
- Client accessed Mental Health Services
- Client on Housing Need Register
- Client engaged in Homelessness Application



This means that for the entire project **34% of those who successfully stayed at the shelter have been accommodated.**
